Between announcing **Rachel Ward** as our new Ambassadorial Scholarship winner, **Keely Robinson** as our first World Peace Scholar Recipient (see page 2), and introducing **Julie Ohlandt**, our Rotary International Ambassadorial Scholar (2006-07)...they had a full day.

Ms. Ohlandt is a James Island High School graduate who went on to Queens College (now University) in Charlotte NC.

Julie went to Chile to attend the University of Southern Chile. She stated, “it changed my life!” But she also apologized for wearing casual black shoes and keeping time with her cell phone since “no one in my generation” wears a watch. She spent the year of graduate studies getting her degree in rural development...but she learned much more.

First, some parts of Chile are cold: “thanks a lot!” They have the driest desert in the world; active volcanoes; shorelines to the Pacific; lakes and waterfall that take your breath. But after living in Santiago (where one-third of their population lives), Valenderia (where they had the coldest winter on record), and various other locations she realized: “nothing compares to the people; my fellow classmates (Cuba, Columbia, Philippines); and I’m an ambassador for Rotary and our Club.”

Announcements:

Annual Meeting to be Held November 25th, 2008:

President Andy announced that our annual meeting will be held on **Tuesday, November 25th**. Please mark this date on your calendars and plan to attend. At this meeting the members will vote on two items:

- Four new board members – Board nominating information as well as the list of eligible members can be found on **page 4** of this issue. All eligible members will be listed on the final ballot unless they notify **Carroll Schweers** prior to **Tuesday, November 18** and ask to have their name removed.
- Amend the current Club By-laws to reflect a 70% attendance requirement for board candidates versus the current 80% requirement.

“To be eligible for selection to the Board of Directors, a selectee must, as stated above, be a member in good standing of the Rotary Club of Charleston (with no current dues delinquencies) and must be a member of the Rotary Club of Charleston for at least twenty four (24) months as of October 1 of the year in which the election is to occur. Additionally, the selectee must: have exhibited regular and reliable attendance of at least 80% (change to 70%) including make-ups over the past twelve (12) months and must not have served on the Board in the prior twelve (12) months unless otherwise permitted herein. The nominating committee will publish these criteria to the membership prior to the annual meeting.”

Change in Club Status

If you plan a change in your club membership status to Active, Excused, Leave of Absence or if you are planning to resign from the club, please notify **Carroll Schweers in writing NO LATER than December 1, 2008**. This will affect January 1st billing. All current members who officially resign after December 1st will be billed \$42 to cover Rotary International dues, which are paid the first of the billing cycle. If you have any questions, please contact **Carroll at 971-4352**.

Our Club's First World Peace Scholar

The Rotary Foundation has awarded a World Peace Fellowship to **Keely C. Robinson** who was sponsored by our club. Keely hopes to study at the Universidad del Salvador in Buenos Aires, Argentina. Her goal is a Master's Degree in International Relations.

Keely is a 2005 graduate of Yale University, which she attended on a swimming scholarship. She recently returned from Thailand, where as a selected Fellow of the Princeton in Asia program spent three years as a high school English teacher and college advisor in Chiang Mai, Thailand. While in Thailand, she organized the first ever HIV AIDS awareness program and prevention campaign in one of the most AIDS infected areas of Thailand. Before her program, schools in Thailand provided little or no safe sex education.

Keely is fluent in Spanish, Thai, and conversational Mandarin Chinese. She is a graduate of Porter Gaud and the daughter of **Mr. and Mrs. Michael Robinson** of Charleston.

INGREDIENTS	TOOLS
<p>=====</p> <p>5 chopped medium onions 5 cloves of chopped garlic 2 tbsp of olive oil 2.5 pounds of ground pork 1 heaping teaspoon of curry powder 1 teaspoon of cumin 1/2 teaspoon of garlic powder 1/4 teaspoon of cinnamon 1 cup or dark beer 3 large cans of crushed tomatoes 1 jar of roasted sweet red peppers 1 small can of corn niblets 1 can of black beans 1 heaping tablespoon of dried cilantro 1 large handful of fresh basil</p>	<p>=====</p> <p>Big pot Crock pot</p>



DIRECTIONS

1. Get good team of cooks to help.
2. In large pot over medium heat, sauté onions in 1 tablespoon of olive oil until transparent. Add garlic and cook until lightly browned. Remove onion and garlic mixture and set aside.
3. Add 1 tablespoon of olive oil to pot. Add ground pork and brown. Season with salt and pepper.
4. When browned, remove any fat, if necessary. Return to pot and add curry, cumin, garlic powder and cinnamon. Incorporate into meat mixture.
5. After a couple of minutes, add cup of dark beer to deglaze pot (scrape browned bits from pot to get flavor incorporated into the meat).
6. About the same time, In a crock pot, add crushed tomatoes and chopped sweet red peppers. Add meat mixture. Stir.
7. Wash canned black beans in water to remove gook from can. Add to crock pot.
8. Strain canned corn. Add to crock pot.
9. Add cilantro. Chop fresh basil and add to crock pot.
10. Cook slowly on low heat for at least 4 hours. If you think it needs more curry, add more.

BOARD MEMBER NOMINATIONS

In line with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Rotary Club of Charleston, the secretary shall supply each member in good standing with a roster giving the names of those members who are eligible to serve on the Board of Directors.

The By-Laws were revised in September 2007 and state that to be eligible for election to the Board of Directors, a selectee, must be a member in good standing of the Rotary Club of Charleston (with no current dues delinquencies) and must be a member of the Rotary Club of Charleston for at least twenty four (24) months as of October 1 of the year in which the election is to occur. Additionally, the selectee must have exhibited regular and reliable attendance of at least 80% (including make-ups) over the past twelve (12) months and must not have served on the Board in the prior twelve (12) months unless otherwise permitted herein.

The list of eligible members shall be presented to the members of the Club who shall by ballot, during November annually, each indicate their first through fourth preferences from the below list of eligible members to serve on the Board of Directors for the coming year. Each member, in attendance at the annual meeting, or by proxy previously submitted, shall have four (4) votes to elect the four (4) new Board Members. **The annual meeting will be held Tuesday, November 25.**
