**A Little History on the Rotary Foundation**

Aich Klumph of the Rotary Club of Cleveland started the "Rotary Endowment Fund". Then in 1925 the Minneapolis Convention changed the Fund's name to "The Rotary Foundation". The first donation check was presented to The "International Society for Crippled Children" in 1929 on behalf of the Foundation. World War II hurt the Foundation very badly however there was a move to add \$5 to the dues in 1942 to combat the lack of resources available. As always, Rotarians stepped up to help the cause. One such Rotarian who gave of his personal resources and time was a man by the name of Paul Harris. In 1947 Paul Harris died. Upon his death, there was a request for \$10 donations in his honor and the money started pouring in. However, in 1957 donations began to decline so the Foundation started the Paul Harris Fellow for \$1,000 in his honor.

The Foundation places their main emphasis on three components; Polio Plus, Ambassadorial Scholarships, and Group Study Exchange. The Foundation raises about \$130M per year to benefit these causes. There are also three main funds. The Annual Programs Fund provides grants and awards through various Foundation programs. The Permanent Fund is an endowment from which a portion of the earnings are spent in support of Foundation programs which ensures the long term viability of the Foundation. Lastly but certainly not least is the Polio Plus Fund which supports Rotary's goal of facilitating a polio-free world by eradicating the disease.
